**8221 W. 171<sup>st</sup> Street**

**White Water Canyon Water Park** is 5 acres of swimming, splashing, sliding fun for the whole family! The main pool features zero-depth entry with an interactive children’s play area, a 1-meter diving board and a 3-meter drop slide. Relax in a single or double inner tube as you gently float around the 600-foot lazy river. Water Park passes go on sale March 1<sup>st</sup>!

**Bettenhausen Park**, acquired in 1975, consists of 8.42 beautiful acres focusing on sports and family fun. The park was dedicated to Ruth and Henry Bettenhausen who were instrumental in starting the first Recreation Commission for Tinley Park and acquired Memorial Park, the first park in the village. The Challengers baseball field is ADA accessible.

**Nasebandt “Moose” Park** is named in honor of Eric “Moose” Nasebandt, who was instrumental in starting youth baseball in Tinley Park, this attractive 4.4-acre park is home to two ball fields, and it also provides a delightful playground, shelter and sand volleyball court. The park district acquired this site in 1968.
