\$18 Million More State Funds

We have been granted \$18 million more in state funding to complete the full environmental cleanup of the former mental health center site. The funding will ensure all 280 acres are cleaned up with what our environmental laws require.


Several factors contributed to the need for increased funding, including that cost estimates were prepared during the 2013-2014 timeframe.

In addition, once the cleanup project began last year, our experts were finally able to access all areas of the site, including many areas that have not been accessed for years due to overgrown vegetation and unsafe building conditions. The team was able to better assess the work needed and found the cleanup to be more extensive than initial estimates, in order to complete the abatement and demolition work consistent with environmental laws.

Other factors included inflation and rising construction costs, the continued degradation of the abandoned buildings on site, as well as the need for extensive abatement and additional work to address storm water build up in basements, tunnels and throughout the site.

We are grateful to our partners at the state level, including our local legislators Sen. Michael Hastings and Rep. Robert "Bob" Rita, who have ensured this state funding so that we can continue to move diligently and thoroughly to get this eyesore cleaned up after more than a decade!

We have pledged to clean up the site – without asking our residents to foot the bill!



Demolition Continues
