Commissioner's Park

8139 Hillcrest Lane

Spend a day outdoors with your friends and family at this attractive 2.25-acre park. Named in honor of Tinley Park's many community volunteers who have served as park district commissioners, the park features idyllic walking paths and an entertaining playground for children. **Commissioners Park** was acquired in 1990.

Canine Campus

18200 84th Avenue

Canine Campus is open from dawn to dusk 365 days per year, however, there will be times when the park is closed for scheduled maintenance. The 10-acre site at Nielsen Drive and 84th Avenue is a special place for dogs and their owners to exercise, socialize, and just have some doggone fun! There are three separate fenced areas, one designated as a small dog area (26 lbs. or less), one for large dogs, and one area will be closed to maintain the quality of the turf. The three areas will be rotated to allow the turf in each area to regrow in a cycle. Some features include shelters, benches, water fountains (one for dogs and one for people), agility course, waste disposal bags/receptacles, and plenty of open space to run.

Vogt Woods

6527 W. 171st Street

Scenic and spacious, **Vogt Woods**, which was acquired in 1974, is a favorite picnic spot in Tinley Park. Facilities include a picnic shelter, bean bag boards, Ed Howlett Sr. Football Field, Jim Phelan Playground, and Joe Tholl Ball Field, as well as beautiful open space in a wooded setting. The site adjoins Fulton School Park and has 37.9 acres of recreational family fun! The Vogt Woods Recreation Building, also located within the park, houses various recreational programs, including **Tot Time Preschool**. The building was constructed in 1977.

Tinley Fitness

8125 W. 171st Street

Tinley Fitness offers something for everyone!  **Centennial Park**

7601 167th Street

At 58+ acres, Centennial Park is the district's largest park and features a 12-acre lake (stocked in the spring) with fishing piers, and a scenic walking path. Facilities include playgrounds, picnic shelters, a footbridge, picnic areas, a basketball court, sand volleyball court, and is home to the Extreme Skate Park. Centennial Park was acquired in 1979. **The Outdoor Fitness Zone is being renovated in 2026.**

 **Tinley Park Performing Arts Center**

16801 S. 80th Ave.

The **Tinley Park Performing Arts Center** is the home of our very own Tinley Park Community Theater, Tinley Park-Park District's Children's and Teen's Theaters, and many other performing arts programs. The Center also offers numerous acting and improv classes throughout the year. The theater seats 120 people and is available for rent for corporate meetings, theater performances, birthday parties, and more. Please call (708) 342-4200 for more info.

 **Freedom Park**

7835 Timber Drive

Adjacent to the Tinley Park Library, **Freedom Park** encompasses 15 acres of land and features a state-of-the-art synthetic football/soccer field, a regulation baseball field, softball field, concession building with announcer's booth, 6,000 square foot interactive children's playground, fully accessible parking and wetland area. The park opened in 2007 and is named in honor of our nation's freedom.

 **Landmark Church, Museum & Schoolhouse**

6727 W. 174th Street

Landmark Church, Museum and Schoolhouse **The Tinley Park Historical Society** was organized in 1974 to preserve and document the heritage of Tinley Park and its surrounding areas. The "Old Zion" Lutheran Church, a "prairie gothic" style frame structure built in 1884, was acquired as its home. Now known simply as "The Landmark", it has been the center of the history of Tinley Park, and its surrounding area. The Landmark Church and Museum structures are owned and maintained by the Tinley Park-Park District with the Historical Society overseeing and operating the museum and tours of the facilities.

 **Volunteer Park**


8180 175th Street

This 12-acre gem was acquired by the Park District in 1989 and is named for the volunteers who support the Park District and this Community. Amenities include sand volleyball, playground, basketball shoot-around, two permanent cornhole boards (bring your own bags) and a drinking fountain along with ample parking!

 **Gory Park**

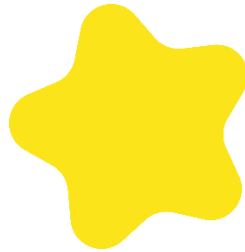
16300 Surrey Drive

When you visit Gory Park, you will notice the 6.82 acres of natural beauty that encompass this park. Park features include ball fields, a playground, picnic shelter, and a sand volleyball court. Gory Park was acquired in 1979 and is named after Richard Gory for his years of service as Park Commissioner and for volunteer work with many groups and organizations in the village.
